RE: Ft. Getty Story Circle – Award of Bid

DATE: June 1, 2015

At the authorization of the Town Council staff solicited bids for the construction of the Ft. Getty Story Circle. Funding for this project was donated by the Roach Family. I have attached a recent letter from Robb Roach indicating that the proposed revised bid (also attached) is adequate in terms of scope and price and the family will cover the full cost of the bid at \$46,000.

BETA, Inc., led by Arek Galle, RLA prepared the plans and specifications for this project, which was funded from the Ft. Getty Capital Account. As you are aware, you, I, Michael Gray, William Piva and Tina Collins have coordinated with BETA on the appropriate placement and scope for this project and fully support the project as funded.

The project subcommittee was made up of you and I as well as Public Works Director Michael Gray, Finance Director Tina Collins, and Director of Parks and Recreation William Piva. This project was listed twice on the City of Newport on-line bidding platform, Eprocurement; March 11, 2015 and April 15, 2015. In the first round of bidding both responsive bids exceeded the amount of funding available, one bid was non-responsive and one bid was received late. We then amended some of the specifications, with the intent of lowering the bids and received only one bid. We negotiated with that bidder and agreed upon a scope of work and a price. Please refer to the revised scope from Bel Terra Landscaping, Inc.

Based on the revised scope and the agreement from the Roach Family to fully fund the project, we are pleased to unanimously recommend awarding the bid for the Ft. Getty Story Circle to Bel Terra Landscaping for a fee of \$46,000.

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



School Committee Resolution on Gun Free Schools

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Current state law allows Concealed Carry Permit ("CCP") holders to carry firearms onto school grounds; and

WHEREAS: The vast majority of states do not permit firearms on school grounds; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: A two year comprehensive Final Report of the Sandy Hook Advisory Commission, consisting of school administrators, teachers, law enforcement, psychiatrists, law makers and legal professionals, dated February 2015, made findings including "Safe School Climate" and "Safe School Design and Operations Strategies" that specifically did not include the use of firearms or the arming of teachers or non-law enforcement civilians in schools; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: The National School Boards Association believes that students must have safe and supportive climates and learning environments that support their opportunities to learn and that are free of abuse, violence, bullying, weapons, and harmful substances including alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: The Rhode Island Association of School Committees' Executive Board have voted to support banning concealed weapons on school grounds, except for duly authorized members of law enforcement; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: The Rhode Island School Superintendents' Association have adopted the School Superintendents Association "AASA Position Paper on School Safety: A response to the Tragedy at Sandy Hook Elementary," which specifically denounces "efforts to bring more guns into our schools by teachers and administrators," and reminds us that "schools remain the safest place for children"; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Rhode Island education leadership has carefully considered and implemented regularly audited school and district-wide building safety plans and emergency protocols inclusive of first-responders, local law enforcement, and the school community:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Exeter-West Greenwich Regional School District School Committee respectfully requests the Rhode Island General Assembly to support 2015–H 5861 & 2015 – S 0743.

OPPOSING SENATE BILL S-0510 AND HOUSE BILL H-5777

WHEREAS: The Town Council of the Town of Exeter has been notified that Senate Bill S-0510 and House Bill H-5777 have been introduced proposing the legalization of marijuana in Rhode Island; and

WHEREAS: The Federal government has designated marijuana as a Schedule I Controlled Substance; and

WHEREAS: The Rocky Mountain High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area has been tracking the negative impacts of marijuana use in the State of Colorado for the past 10 to 15 years. Their most recent reports published in August of 2014 and April of 2015 detail these impacts with respect to several issues of concern including Highway Safety, Youth and Adult Marijuana Use, Emergency Room Admissions; Public Safety; and Crime; and

WHEREAS: The current Diagnostic and Statistical Manual (DSM-V) of Mental Disorders, published in 2013 by the American Psychiatric Association, identifies six specific cannabis-related and induced diagnoses, including: a) Cannabis Use Disorder (addiction); b) Cannabis Intoxication; c) Cannabis Withdrawal; d) Cannabis Induced Anxiety Disorder; e) Cannabis Induced Psychosis and f) Cannabis Induced Sleep Disorder; and

WHEREAS: Marijuana has been shown through two decades or more of rigorous scientific research to have serious, often lifelong impacts, on emotional regulation, executive function, impulse control, motivation, and brain development; and

WHEREAS: With respect to marijuana, there is a demonstrated correlation between increased access and decreased perception of risk or harm, which, in turn, has been shown to result in increased adolescent cannabis consumption rates.

WHEREAS: A detailed fiscal impact statement of the regulatory, public safety, health care, and addiction treatment costs has not been prepared and circulated for public review and discourse; and

WHEREAS: The State of Rhode Island does not need to decide this question at this time since it has the opportunity to wait until the results of thorough, longitudinal research and analysis of legalization in the States of Colorado, Washington, Oregon, and Alaska are available to better inform this decision.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: The Town of Exeter has a priority to create a safe, healthy, and drug free community for Exeter and for its citizens. Therefore, the Town of Exeter and its duly elected representatives respectfully request that all State Senators, State Representatives, and the Honorable Governor Gina Raimondo oppose Senate Bill S-0510 and House Bill H-5777.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ALSO RESOLVED: That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to State Senator Elaine Morgan, State Representatives Justin Price and Doreen Costa, the Honorable Speaker of the House Nicholas Mattiello, the Honorable President of the Senate Teresa Paiva-Weed, and Her Excellency Governor Gina Raimondo, and to each municipality in Rhode Island requesting their support in opposing any legislation that would legalize marijuana for recreational use in the State of Rhode Island.

SUBJECT: IN SUPPORT OF H 6040, H 6041 & H 6042, H 6043, S 816, S 818 AND S 820 REGARDING THE STATE GUIDE PLAN AND STATEWIDE PLANNING PROGRAM AND PROVIDING FOR MUNICIPAL CHOICE AS TO RHODEMAP RI

WHEREAS, The Town of Foster, while affirming its support of affordable housing, is concerned with new pre-emptions of local zoning and planning authority; and

WHEREAS, RhodeMap RI, through the state guide plan, in conjunction with commitments made in certifications to the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), could result in new pre-emptions of local zoning and planning authority; and

WHEREAS, H 6041, H 6042 and S 820 would provide municipalities with the choice to opt out of provisions contained in the new state guide plan that exceed the current affordable housing requirements and any related land use provisions; and

WHEREAS, H 6040 and S816 would prohibit the state guide plan from including provisions that exceed the current affordable housing requirements in the state guide plan; and

WHEREAS, H6043 and S818 would repeal references to compliance with the state guide plan relative to local comprehensive plans;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Council of the Town of Foster hereby urges the Honorable Members of the General Assembly to pass H 6040, H 6041, H 6042, H 6043, S 816, S 818 and S 820.



School Committee Resolution On Gun Free Schools



WHEREAS: The vast majority of states do not permit firearms on school grounds; and

WHEREAS: A study by the Violence Policy Center, a Washington D.C. gun safety organization, found, from May 2007 to February 2015, that in research involving 722 deaths in 544 concealed-carry shootings in 36 states and the District of Columbia, the vast majority of those killings were deemed non self-defense and only 16 cases were eventually ruled lawful self-defense; and

WHEREAS: A two year comprehensive Final Report of the Sandy Hook Advisory Commission, consisting of school administrators, teachers, law enforcement, psychiatrists, law makers and legal professionals, dated February 2015, made findings including "Safe School Climate" and "Safe School Design and Operations Strategies" that specifically did not include the use of firearms or the of arming teachers or non-law enforcement civilians in schools; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: The National School Boards Association believes that students must have safe and supportive climates and learning environments that support their opportunities to learn and that are free of abuse, violence, bullying, weapons, and harmful substances including alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs; and

WHEREAS: The Rhode Island Association of School Committees' Executive Board have voted to support banning concealed weapons on school grounds, except for duly authorized members of law enforcement; and
